Summary of Results: Maintained the DRSWD website. Maintained the storm water hotline. Returned calls within three days of receiving messages. Responded to all Request for Assistance forms. There were 45 Requests for Assistance calls resulting in 36 projects.

Comments: In 2019, the Township IT staff migrated the DRSWD website over to the Township's website. This is to allow more consistency, more timely updating of information, and ease of access for Township residents. As part of the transition, some of the information that was previously available was taken down but resources will be added back as the site is improved.

Summary of Results: WCSWCD presented material to Deerfield Township school age children reaching 3,280 students with 134 presentations. WCSWCD presented material or made information available to 2,429 people at county-wide events. There were also 1,700 Deerfield Township residents that visited the Water Education Trailer at locally sponsored events. The WCSWCD facebook page had a total reach of 53,768 and twitter had 10,924 impressions. They distributed 9,400 newsletters and had 3,031 unique views on their email newsletters. The Regional Storm water Collaborative promoted storm water messages through the following avenues: 9,616 users and 24,282 page views on savelocalwaters.org; 3 YouTube videos with 899 views; 186 spots on WLWT with a reach of 814,449; 3 workshops with at total of 252 attendees; and more than 100,000 in attendance during the Rain Barrel Art Project Display.

Comments: Media outreach is available to 100% of the population. Some events are considered Warren County-wide events or region-wide events. A percentage of this number is expected to be Deerfield Township residents.
